Being Responsive to Children and Families: Engaging Families

Use these ideas and questions to build on what you've learned and extend your practice.

THINK ABOUT IT!

Self-Reflection Use these questions to think about your own practice.

- Reflect with Others Supervisors, directors, coaches, and teachers/ providers can be reflective partners.
- The Power of Practice Invite a colleague to join you; observe or record each other and share ideas.

REFLECTIVE QUESTIONS

- What do I know about families' interest and availability to participate in the program? How can I learn more about how families would like to contribute?
- How can I learn about the preferences, hopes, and dreams families have for their children?
- What small changes can I make in my practice to better support families' preferences, hopes, and dreams?
- What decisions can families help me make in the classroom or program?
- How comfortable am I engaging families as co-teachers?
- How can I stretch myself to find creative ways for families to actively participate in children's learning?

- Reflect on the ways you engage families as co-supporters, co-decision-makers, and co-teachers.
- Brainstorm additional ideas for how you can engage families as cosupporters, co-decision-makers, and co-teachers.

Co-supporters Learn from families about their preferences, hopes, and dreams for their children.		
Co-decision-makers Collaborate with families in making decisions about learning goals for their child and the curriculum.		
Co-teachers Offer families various opportunities to actively participate in learning experiences.
