GUIDING QUESTIONS

- What did the teacher/provider do to maintain individual children's attention?
- What were the recommendations for using small groups?
- How did the teacher/provider individualize the story for the child who spoke in 2–3 word utterances?
- What did the teacher/provider do to make the book more accessible for all children?

KEY CONSIDERATIONS

- How can you use visual supports to enhance individualized learning?
- Thinking about what you've learned in this video, what ideas can you take from this segment to support individual children in your setting?
