- ❖ Win-win for pre-school teachers, ECS, First 5, college campuses


Scholarships as Incentives

- North State QRIS uses all incentive-type funding for QI related activities
 - Funding connected to Quality Improvement Plans (QIP)
 - Large geographic area, little funding
 - Opted against tiered rating-based incentives
 - Address issues of equity in this approach
 - Intrinsic value of QI
 - Culture shift
 - If funding goes away, quality trancencends

Scholarships as Incentives

- Scholarship addresses accessibility barrier
 - Low wages in ECE field
 - No out of pocket costs
 - Books, parking permits, fees, all paid directly by North State QRIS
 - Funding request system evolution
 - Education not compromised



- Distribution
 - ➤ Update
 - > Release
 - Distribute scholarship application
- Requirements
 - > Transcripts
 - Education plan
 - > Financial Aid
 - BOG Fee Waiver
 - FAFSA
 - Academic release
 - Signatures from Director and LPC Coordinator (or designee)

Scholarship Application Process

- Receive and process
 - Applications received by scholarship coordinator
 - > Enter student data
 - > Estimate costs for books/tuition
- Approval and notification
 - Award letters and book voucher
 - Award letters with direction for reimbursement




Scholarship Data

- Scholarship has granted 187 awards to 98 different students
- Those 98 students have taken 410 courses through Fall 2017
- Academic goals attained:
 - ➤ 13 degrees
 - > 8 permits/certificates
 - ➤ 40+ more goals set to be reached by 2020

Distribution of degree goals




- Of the 410 courses taken:
 - 197 courses toward BA degree
 - 34 courses toward MA degree
 - > 179 courses toward AA/permits

Scholarship Dollars: Total Tuition costs from inception through Fall 2017 \$108,963.65. Total Book costs from inception through Fall 2017 - \$37,580.95
