2009-10 REGULAR AND EXTRAORDINARY SESSIONS
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(April 12, 2010)**

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Positions may be taken on bills that directly relate to Proposition 10 financing or mandates.

Administrative Services

- AB 31** **Price** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: Public contracts: Small Business Procurement and Contract Act. **Position:**
Latest Version: (C-10/11/2009)
Location: 10/11/2009-A CHAPTERED
The Small Business Procurement and Contract Act permits a state agency to award a contract for goods, services, or information technology with a value of between \$5,000 and \$100,000 to a certified small business, including a microbusiness and a disabled veteran business enterprise, without complying with specified competitive bidding requirements. This bill increases the maximum amount of the contract from \$100,000 to \$250,000.
- AB 309** **Price** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: Public contracts: small business participation. **Position:**
Latest Version: (A-04/23/2009)
Location: 01/31/2010-A DEAD
This bill would require all state agencies, departments, boards, and commissions to establish and achieve a goal of 25% small business participation in state procurements and contracts, to ensure that the state's procurement and contract processes are administered in order to meet or exceed the goal. The bill would require the Department of General Services (DGS) to monitor and advise state agencies on the progress toward meeting the goal and would provide that information to the Office of Small Business Advocate. The bill would also require a state agency, department, board, or commission that has not achieved the goal by December 31, 2010, to submit an implementation and corrective action plan to DGS on or before August 1, 2011, and every year thereafter as long as that agency fails to meet or exceed the goal.
- AB 514** **De Leon** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: Employment: lactation accommodation. **Position:**
Latest Version: (A-04/02/2009)
Location: 01/31/2010-A DEAD
This bill would require an employer to provide a 20-minute paid rest period for lactation purposes during each 4-hour work period, immediately preceding or following the employee's rest period, and would specify that compliance with this requirement does not satisfy or affect an employer's separate obligation to provide a meal or rest period required by statute or a collective bargaining agreement.
- AB 756** **Eng** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: Public contracts: information: Internet Web site. **Position:**
Latest Version: (V-10/11/2009)
Location: 10/11/2009-A VETOED
This bill would have required a state agency, except as specified, to provide a link to a centrally located and accessible state-run Internet Web site that includes a list of the personal services and consulting services contracts entered into by the agency. The bill would have required the listings on the state's Internet Web site to include specified information, and would require all new contracts to be initially posted within 15 working days of being signed by all parties. The bill would have required contractors to electronically provide specified information to assist state agencies in the reporting of information for the listings of personal services and consulting services contracts.
- AB 1899** **Eng** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: State agencies: information: Internet Web site. **Position:**
Latest Version: (A-03/15/2010)
Location: 03/23/2010-A APPR.
This bill would require, subject to specific exemptions, state agencies, the Department of General Services, and the office of the State Chief Information Officer to post specified audits and contracts to the state's Reporting Transparency in Government Internet Web site. This bill would also require the office of the Governor to post specified financial statements and report to that Internet Web site.

- SB 257** **Pavley** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: Lactation accommodation: state employees. **Position:**
Latest Version: (V-10/11/2009)
Location: 10/11/2009-S VETOED
This bill would have required every state agency and department, including local offices, when notified by a female employee that she is nearing maternity leave, to notify the employee of specified information regarding breast-feeding, including an explanation and summary of the provisions relating to lactation accommodation, information regarding lactation accommodation on the Internet Web site of the Department of Public Health, and a listing of other comprehensive breast-feeding support organizations with Internet links. The bill also would have required the Department of Public Health to provide information regarding lactation accommodation on its Internet Web site.
- SB 502** **Walters** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: State agency Web sites: information. **Position:**
Latest Version: (I-02/26/2009)
Location: 01/15/2010-S DEAD
This bill would require, by no later than January 1, 2010, each state department and agency to develop and operate a searchable Internet Web site to include specified information relating to each expenditure of state funds made by that state department or agency in the most recently completed fiscal year. The bill would allow the user to view specified information and provide input regarding the utility of, and recommendations for, improvements to the searchable Internet Web site.
- SB 642** **Denham** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: Public contracts: Small Business Procurement and Contract Act. **Position:**
Latest Version: (A-05/04/2009)
Location: 01/22/2010-S DEAD
The Small Business Procurement and Contract Act permits a state agency to award a contract for goods, services, or information technology with a value of between \$5,000 and \$100,000 to a certified small business, including a microbusiness and a disabled veteran business enterprise, without complying with specified competitive bidding requirements. This bill would increase the maximum amount of the contract from \$100,000 to \$250,000.
- SB 719** **Huff** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: State agency Internet Web sites: information. **Position:**
Latest Version: (I-02/27/2009)
Location: 01/22/2010-S DEAD
This bill would create the Taxpayer Transparency Act of 2009, which would require each state department and agency to develop and operate a searchable Internet Web site accessible by the public that includes specified information relating to expenditures of state funds, contracts, grants, purchase orders, subcontracts, and tax refunds, rebates, and credits.
- SB 755** **Negrete McLeod** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: State contracts: participation goals: persons with developmental **Position:**
disabilities business enterprises.
Latest Version: (A-05/21/2009)
Location: 01/22/2010-S DEAD
This bill would establish statewide participation goals of not less than 1% for persons with developmental disabilities business enterprises to participate in contracts awarded by a state agency for goods and services, and require, until June 30, 2014, that each state agency awarding contracts take specified actions to encourage that participation.

Budget

- AB 1609** **Evans** **Priority:** Level 1
Title: 2010-11 Budget. **Position:**
Latest Version: (1-01/08/2010)
Location: 01/21/2010-A BUDGET
The Governor's 2010-11 proposed budget reflects a one-time reduction of approximately \$350 million in First 5 California funds to support the Department of Developmental Services and the Department of Social Services safety net programs for children. In addition, the proposed budget reduces First 5 California funds by 50% (\$242 million in 2010-11) over the next 5 years. If the Governor's proposal is approved by the Legislature, a new proposition to redirect Proposition 10 funds will be included on the ballot for the June 2010 election.
- AB 2131** **Bass** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: Budget Act of 2009: revisions. **Position:**
Latest Version: (1-02/18/2010)
Location: 03/04/2010-A BUDGET
This bill would make revisions in those appropriations for the 2009-10 fiscal year, for specified child welfare services purposes.
- ABX4 1** **Evans** **Priority:** Level 1
Title: Budget Act of 2009: revisions. **Position:**
Latest Version: (C-07/28/2009)
Location: 07/28/2009-A CHAPTERED
This bill made revisions in the appropriations allocated in the Budget Act of 2009.
- SB 874** **Ducheny** **Priority:** Level 1
Title: 2010-11 Budget. **Position:**
Latest Version: (1-01/08/2010)
Location: 01/21/2010-S BUDGET & F.R.
The Governor's 2010-11 proposed budget reflects a one-time reduction of approximately \$350 million in First 5 California funds to support the Department of Developmental Services and the Department of Social Services safety net programs for children. In addition, the proposed budget reduces First 5 California funds by 50% (\$242 million in 2010-11) over the next 5 years. If the the Governor's proposal is approved by the Legislature, a new proposition to redirect Proposition 10 funds will be included on the ballot for the June 2010 election.
- SBX3 1** **Ducheny** **Priority:** Level 2
Title: 2009-10 Budget. **Position:**
Latest Version: (C-02/20/2009)
Location: 02/20/2009-S CHAPTERED
This bill makes appropriations, enacts statutory changes for support of state government, and reflects the final decisions of the Legislative Leadership relative to the 2009-10 Budget.
- SBX3 2** **Ducheny** **Priority:** Level 2
Title: Budget Act of 2008: revisions. **Position:**
Latest Version: (C-02/20/2009)
Location: 02/20/2009-S CHAPTERED
This bill amends and supplements appropriations to the Budget Act of 2008. The bill states legislative intent to utilize \$5,000,000 in funds from any of the accounts from the California Children and Families Commission for information, services, and supports provided under the Early Start Program as administered by the Department of Developmental Services. This language is not intended to affect any contingencies or emergencies of which the Department of Finance may choose to notify the Legislature in the 2008-09 fiscal year.

Child Care

- AB 932** **Torlakson** **Priority:** Level 2
Title: Child care and development services: facilities. **Position:**
Latest Version: (A-04/27/2009)
Location: 01/31/2010-A DEAD
This bill would specify that funds from the Child Care Facilities Revolving Fund be used to make loans to eligible borrowers for the purchase, development, construction, expansion, renovation, repair, or improvement of licensed child care. The bill would authorize the Superintendent of Public Instruction to transfer federal funds appropriated for child care facilities into the fund. The bill would require the California Department of Education to utilize the capital financing expertise of the child care financial intermediary program to administer the fund, and to adopt regulations to implement these procedures and manage the fund.
- AB 1195** **Brownley** **Priority:** Level 2
Title: Child care and development programs: advisory committee. **Position:**
Latest Version: (I-02/27/2009)
Location: 01/22/2010-A DEAD
Existing law requires the Governor to appoint an advisory committee to assist the California Department of Education (CDE) in developing a state plan for child development programs pursuant to that act. This bill would require the advisory committee to assist CDE in the development of a plan to implement any new federal grant funds made available after March 1, 2009, for child care and development programs and early childhood education.
- AB 1368** **Adams** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: Child day care: safety. **Position:**
Latest Version: (C-10/11/2009)
Location: 10/11/2009-A CHAPTERED
This bill expands existing provisions of law to include all family day care homes in the requirement of ensuring that at least one staff member who has a current course completion in pediatric first and and pediatric CPR is onsite when childrent are present to all family day care homes. By enlarging the scope of an existing crime, the bill imposes a state-mandated local program.
- AB 1979** **Adams** **Priority:** Level 2
Title: Child day care centers: inspections. **Position:**
Latest Version: (I-02/17/2010)
Location: 03/04/2010-A HUM. S.
This bill would require the Department of Social Services to make annual unannounced visits of all licensed child day care centers.
- AB 2084** **Brownley** **Priority:** Level 2
Title: Child day care facilities: nutrition. **Position:**
Latest Version: (I-02/18/2010)
Location: 03/04/2010-A HUM. S.
This bill would require a licensed child day care facility to follow specified guidelines relating to the provision of beverages.

- AB 2463** **Brownley** **Priority:** Level 2
Title: Child care resource and referral programs.
Latest Version: (1-02/19/2010)
Location: 03/11/2010-A HUM. S.
This bill would delete provisions expressing the Legislature's intent to appropriate certain funds for allocation to resource and referral agencies. The bill would require a child care resource and referral program to provide specified additional services, including providing training and workshops relating to child care services, community resource assistance, and collaborating with and assisting other community agencies in planning, coordinating, and improving child care. The bill would delete provisions authorizing a resource and referral program to provide short-term respite care, as defined. The bill would require a resource and referral program to provide basic child care referrals at no cost. This bill would establish 2 projects, to be known as the California Child Care Initiative Project - State Program, and the California Child Care Initiative Project - Quality Plan Program, and would require the Superintendent to allocate funds, including funds from the federal Child Care and Development Block Grant quality set-aside, in accordance with specified requirements. The bill would establish the Growing, Learning, Caring Project to foster and improve the quality of child care in all settings, including child care settings that are exempt from licensing requirements.
- SB 1225** **Yee** **Priority:** Level 2
Title: City and County of San Francisco: individualized county child care subsidy plan.
Latest Version: (1-02/18/2010)
Location: 03/04/2010-S ED.
This bill would authorize the City and County of San Francisco to implement an individualized county child care subsidy plan until June 30, 2016, and would require the city and county to phase out the plan by January 1, 2018. The bill would require the city and county to demonstrate an increase in earned child days of enrollment by the end of the first fiscal year of operation under the child care subsidy plan submitted to and approved by the Child Development Division of the department after January 1, 2010. The bill would require the city and county, on or before December 31, 2016, to submit a final report to the Legislature and other specified entities that summarizes the impact of the plan. The bill would repeal those provisions on January 1, 2018.
- SCR 44** **Corbett** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: Child care.
Latest Version: (A-03/15/2010)
Location: 03/15/2010-A ED.
This measure would request the Legislature to review California's current regional market rate survey for subsidized child care. The bill would also request that all vested stakeholders be included in the planning and implementation process being undertaken by the California Department of Education to establish new rates or a new rate structure.

Children Services

- AB 422** **Torres** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: State Youth and Family Master Plan.
Latest Version: (A-04/21/2009)
Location: 01/31/2010-A DEAD
This bill would require the Secretary of California Health and Human Services to develop the State Youth and Family Master Plan to achieve specified goals that include setting the general guiding principles the State should follow when developing policies affecting the State's youth and families and identifying all state governmental entities responsible for delivering services to youth and families and bridging the communication gaps between those entities. The bill would require the secretary to schedule meetings, as specified, that seek input from certain government, nonprofit, and private sector stakeholders.

- AB 488** **Torres** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: Children's services programs: performance agreement contracts.
Position:
Latest Version: (C-10/11/2009)
Location: 10/11/2009-A CHAPTERED
Under existing law, each county may enter into performance agreements with private, nonprofit agencies to encourage innovation in the delivery of children's services, to develop services not available in the community, and to promote change in the child welfare services system. Existing law limits these performance agreements to a period of 3 years. This bill authorizes the Department of Social Services to renew or extend the performance agreements for up to an additional 3 years beyond the original 3-year time period and require an independent evaluation and reporting regarding the waiver, and make conforming changes.
- ABX4 9** **Evans** **Priority:** Level 2
Title: Developmental services.
Position:
Latest Version: (C-07/28/2009)
Location: 07/28/2009-A CHAPTERED
Existing law, under the California Early Intervention Services Act, requires an eligible infant or toddler receiving services under the act to have an individualized family service plan. The plan is required to be in writing and to address specified issues, including a statement of the specific early intervention services needed to meet the unique needs of the infant or toddler. This bill revises the definition of an eligible infant or toddler for purposes of eligibility for services. The bill would also revise the contents of the individualized family service plan, including requiring the development, review, or modification of an individualized family service plan to consider certain group training and preschool activities and would make related changes. The bill also requires the Department of Developmental Services to establish a prevention program for at-risk babies under which intake, assessment, case management, and referral to generic agencies would be provided.
- ACR 80** **Hill** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: Bill of Rights for the Children and Youth of California.
Position:
Latest Version: (C-09/16/2009)
Location: 09/16/2009-A CHAPTERED
This measure would declare the Legislature's support for a Bill of Rights for the Children and Youth of California that resolves to invest in all children and youth so that certain goals may be achieved.
- SB 244** **Wright** **Priority:** Level 2
Title: Children's services: high-risk children.
Position:
Latest Version: (A-03/18/2010)
Location: 03/22/2010-A RLS.
The bill would give certain high-risk children the right to continuous enrollment in a state preschool program or a child care and development program that is licensed or is operated by a local educational agency if the child's residence or placement changes. This bill would also give first priority to neglected or abused children who are in family maintenance, family preservation, and unification, and to certain other high-risk children who meet specified criteria. The bill would expand eligibility requirements to include certain other high-risk children, and would also require first priority to be given to children from birth to 5 years of age who meet specified requirements.

Education

- AB 220** **Brownley** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: Public education facilities: Kindergarten-University Public Education Facilities Bond Act. **Position:**
Latest Version: (A-01/15/2010)
Location: 02/11/2010-S ED.
This bill would make various changes to K-12 education facility programs. Specifically the bill authorizes a school district, for the purposes of K-12 new construction funds, to calculate enrollment projections for the 10th year beyond the fiscal year in which the application is made and to use the number of pupils housed in permanent school facilities, as opposed to portable facilities. Previous versions of the bill contained intent language to place an education bond on the next statewide general election. The author removed the provision in policy committee and stated that she intends to continue working on a bond and will reinstate bond language if and when there is agreement to do so. The current version of the bill contains technical amendments to the School Facility Program, which establishes the parameters for state education bond allocations and the use of funds.
- AB 346** **Torlakson** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: Joint-use school facilities. **Position:**
Latest Version: (A-07/23/2009)
Location: 07/23/2009-S APPR.
This bill would authorize the State Allocation Board to provide a grant to fund a joint-use project on property that is adjacent to a schoolsite and owned by a governmental entity. The joint-use agreement would be required to provide that the land would be leased to the school district for a period that reflects the useful life of the facility to be constructed. The bill would expand the types of projects that would be eligible to be built using grant funds. Those projects would include a child health and wellness clinic and various other educational programs that meet current state content standards.
- AB 1967** **Mendoza** **Priority:** Level 2
Title: Pupil admission: kindergarten and first grade. **Position:**
Latest Version: (I-02/17/2010)
Location: 03/04/2010-A ED.
This bill would change the required birthday for kindergarten and first grade admission to November 2 for the 2012-13 school year, October 2 for the 2013-14 school year, and September 2 for the 2014-15 school year and each school year thereafter. This bill, in order to compensate school districts for the loss in average daily attendance (ADA) resulting from changing the age at which children are required to be admitted to kindergarten, would increase the number of ADA units computed for a school district.
- AB 2592** **Buchanan** **Priority:** Level 1
Title: Early Learning Quality Improvement System. **Position:**
Latest Version: (A-04/08/2010)
Location: 04/08/2010-A ED.
This bill would require the California Department of Education to develop and implement a quality rating scale based on the Early Learning Quality Improvement System Advisory Committee's recommendations. The bill would also require the California State Advisory Council on Early Childhood Education and Care to conduct an annual review of the quality rating scale, and provide ongoing recommendations for improvement.

- ABX5 2** **Coto** **Priority:** Level 2
Title: Public schools: Race to the Top application.
Latest Version: (A-12/03/2009)
Location: 01/13/2010-A DEAD
The federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA), provides \$4.3 billion for the State Incentive Grant Fund (Race to the Top Fund), which is a competitive grant program designed to encourage and reward states that are implementing specified educational reforms in 4 specified areas: (1) achieving equity in teacher distribution, (2) improving collection and use of data, (3) implementing standards and assessments, and (4) supporting struggling schools. This bill would require the Governor, the Superintendent of Public Instruction, and the President of the State Board of Education to ensure that California's application for a grant under the Race to the Top Fund includes specified provisions, including, among others, a limit on the amount of grant funds that may be used for expenditures that occur at the California Department of Education (CDE) and county offices of education, and for administrative costs of local educational agencies.
- ABX5 7** **Nestande** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: Teachers.
Latest Version: (I-11/23/2009)
Location: 01/13/2010-A DEAD
This bill would authorize a school district to use data from the California Education Information System, including data from the California Longitudinal Pupil Achievement Data System, for purposes of evaluating the performance of a certificated employee and determining whether to require the employee to complete professional development activities as a result of the evaluation.
- ABX5 8** **Brownley** **Priority:** Level 2
Title: Public schools: Race to the Top.
Latest Version: (A-12/10/2009)
Location: 01/13/2010-A DEAD
This bill proposes comprehensive changes to the Education Code consistent with the federal Race to the Top program. The bill addresses the four key policy reform areas that 1) refine the state's current rigorous state standards; 2) provide new supports for teachers and principals aimed at improving effectiveness; 3) enhance local data systems and coordinate those systems with state data systems; and 4) dramatically improve the state's persistently lowest-achieving schools.
- ACR 99** **Buchanan** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: Day of the Special Educator.
Latest Version: (I-01/04/2010)
Location: 01/07/2010-A RLS.
This measure would proclaim December 3, 2010, to be the Day of the Special Educator, and would urge Californians to recognize the dedication and hard work of special educators in teaching pupils with unique needs.
- SB 19** **Simitian** **Priority:** Level 1
Title: Education data.
Latest Version: (C-10/11/2009)
Location: 10/11/2009-S CHAPTERED
Existing law requires the State Chief Information Officer to convene a working group representing specified entities to create a strategic plan to link education data systems and to accomplish specified objectives relating to the accessibility of education data. The State Chief Information Officer is required to deliver this strategic plan to the Legislature and the Governor no later than September 1, 2009. This bill authorizes these provisions to be implemented using federal grant funds received pursuant to the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 through that act's provision of funds for statewide data systems under the federal Education Technical Assistance Act.

- SB 293** **Runner** **Priority:** Level 2
Title: Pupil admission: kindergarten and 1st grade. **Position:**
Latest Version: (1-02/25/2009)
Location: 01/15/2010-S DEAD
This bill would change the required birthday for kindergarten and 1st grade admission from December 2 to November 1 for the 2010-11 school year, October 1 for the 2011-12 school year, and September 1 for the 2012-13 school year and each school year thereafter. An elementary school would be required, until and including the 2012-13 school year, to admit a child to the 1st grade if the child has completed one school year of kindergarten.
- SB 331** **Romero** **Priority:** Level 2
Title: Migrant education. **Position:**
Latest Version: (A-05/28/2009)
Location: 07/09/2009-A ED.
This bill would require the state master plan and state services delivery plan to be developed and revised as necessary by the Superintendent of Public Instruction and the statewide parent advisory council, and would require the plan to include the collection of individual and aggregate data for migrant pupils. This bill would require interpretation to be provided at each state and regional migrant parent advisory council meeting by a person trained in interpreting and who is fully fluent in English and in the language understandable to the parents.
- SB 1126** **Liu** **Priority:** Level 2
Title: Public postsecondary education: student transfer: early **Position:**
childhood education: transfer courses.
Latest Version: (A-04/06/2010)
Location: 04/06/2010-S APPR.
This bill would require the Academic Senates of the California Community Colleges and the California State University to review the lower division 8 common core courses in child development or early education identified by the Early Childhood Curriculum Alignment Project in conjunction with early childhood faculty to improve early childhood educator program articulation, and in doing so, to consider and make findings on specified topics and to report those findings to the Legislature and the Legislative Analyst's Office, on or before December 1, 2011, along with other specified recommendations and suggestions. The bill would require the California State University to deem specified transferring community college students as having fulfilled lower division coursework requirements, and not require these students to take more total units in child development or early education to satisfy graduation requirements for the related majors than other enrolled students.
- SB 1357** **Steinberg** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: California Longitudinal Pupil Achievement Data System. **Position:**
Latest Version: (A-04/05/2010)
Location: 04/05/2010-S ED.
This bill would require the California Department of Education, contingent on federal funding for this purpose, to prepare CALPADS (California Longitudinal Pupil Achievement Data System) to include data on pupil absences. The bill would require that CALPADS be capable of issuing periodic reports to local educational agencies on the rates of absence for each pupil and reports on chronic absences, as defined. The bill would state the intent of the Legislature to support the development of early warning systems to identify and support individual pupils who are at risk of academic failure or of dropping out of school.

- SB 1381** **Simitian** **Priority:** Level 2
Title: Kindergarten Readiness Pilot Program.
Latest Version: (A-03/23/2010)
Location: 03/23/2010-S ED.
This bill would change the required birthday for admission to kindergarten and first grade to November 1 for the 2012-13 school year, October 1 for the 2013-14 school year, and September 1 for the 2014-15 school year and each school year thereafter. To the extent those changes establish new administrative duties on the governing boards of school districts in implementing the changes, they would impose a state-mandated local program. The bill would state the intent of the Legislature to appropriate in the annual Budget Act 1/2 of the savings resulting from changes enacted by this bill for purposes of expanding the state preschool program.
- SB 1421** **Romero** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: Education funds: Race to the Top.
Latest Version: (I-02/19/2010)
Location: 03/11/2010-S RLS.
This bill would state the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation to make needed changes in the law to assist California in competing for Race to the Top grant funds.
- SB 1422** **Romero** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: Race to the Top.
Latest Version: (I-02/19/2010)
Location: 03/11/2010-S RLS.
This bill would state the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation with respect to the Race to the Top program.
- SB 1423** **Romero** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: Race to the Top program.
Latest Version: (I-02/19/2010)
Location: 03/11/2010-S RLS.
This bill would state the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation relating to the Race to the Top program.
- SB 1424** **Romero** **Priority:** Level 3
Title: Race to the Top program.
Latest Version: (I-02/19/2010)
Location: 03/11/2010-S RLS.

This measure declares April 2009 as Autism Awareness Month and recognizes that individuals with an autism spectrum disorder (ASD) are valued and important members of society. This measure recognizes the parents and relatives of individuals with ASDs for their sacrifice and dedication in providing for the special needs of individuals with ASDs. This measure also declares the Legislature's continued support of the work of specified organizations related to ASDs. The bill specifically states whereas, First 5 California has made the issue of autism for children who are five years of age and younger an important priority, including the First 5 California Special Needs Project which indicates that 19 percent of children suffer from developmental delays or disabilities that are frequently undetected by routine examinations during the first five years of life. Further, this measure resolves that the Legislature continue to support the important work of the Legislative Blue Ribbon Commission on Autism, the Superintendent's Autism Advisory Committee, the University of California, Davis M.I.N.D. Institute, First 5 California, Families for Early Autism Treatment (FEAT), and others as specified in the bill.
