The role of California Surgeon General was created in 2019 by Governor Gavin Newsom with the understanding that some of the most pernicious, but least addressed health challenges are the upstream factors that eventually become chronic and acute conditions that are far more difficult and expensive to treat. The role of the California Surgeon General is to advise the Governor, serve as a leading spokesperson on matters of public health and marshal the insights and energy of medical professionals, scientists, public health experts, public servants and everyday Californians to drive solutions to our most pressing public health challenges.

As California's first Surgeon General, Dr. Nadine Burke Harris has established early childhood, health equity, and Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and toxic stress as key priorities. Dr. Burke Harris has set a bold goal to reduce ACEs and toxic stress by half in one generation. Under the leadership of Governor Newsom, and in partnership with California Health and Human Services Secretary, Dr. Mark Ghaly, and

statewide health and community leaders, Dr. Burke Harris is advancing systemic reforms that recognize, and respond to, the effects of ACEs on lifelong health.

The first Surgeon General's report "Roadmap for Resilience: The California Surgeon General's Report on Adverse Childhood Experiences, Toxic Stress, and Health", serves as a blueprint for how communities, states, and nations can recognize and effectively address ACEs and toxic stress as a root cause to some of the most harmful, persistent, and expensive societal and health challenges facing our world today.
