SUMMARY OF THE ISSUE

Under the authority of the Executive Director, and in partnership with SupplyBank.Org, First 5 California will invest up to \$149,999 to support a six-month pilot for supplying “Baby Hygiene Kits” (Kits) to low-income families in six counties. As part of the October

2017 agenda, Benito Delgado-Olson, Executive Director of SupplyBank.Org, will present an overview of the pilot for the Commission.

RECOMMENDATION

This is an information-only item. First 5 California staff is not requesting action at this time.

BACKGROUND OF KEY ISSUES

SupplyBank.Org is a 501(3)(c) non-profit organization, which began at UC Berkeley in 2009 as a regional effort to bring school supplies to tens of thousands of low-income children throughout the California Bay Area. SupplyBank.Org has a business model based on the modern food bank, including fulfillment and distribution centers for non-food materials throughout California. In response to a current statewide diaper hygiene problem, its pilot “Baby Hygiene Kit Program” will focus on providing diapers and other baby-related products to families in need.

SupplyBank.Org is launching a pilot program with several dozen local and state agencies to build a best practices model for the Baby Hygiene Kit Program. This program started in the fall of 2016 and distributes Kits throughout the state. Providing Kits to low-income and homeless families may reduce the number of serious health-related issues (such as diaper dermatitis, candidiasis, and urinary tract infections) in diaper age children.

As a state-agency partner, First 5 California will invest in a six-month pilot to supply Kits to low-income families in six counties. The Kit boxes, diapers, baby hygiene products, and other collateral materials will be customized with messaging and images from First 5 California’s *Talk. Read. Sing.*® campaign – all serving as reminders and prompts for parents and caregivers of young children to use every-day moments, like diaper changing time, to engage in positive verbal interactions that promote a baby’s healthy brain growth.
